Where does internal audit sit?

- Direct link between successful project delivery and internal audit.
 - Both are concerned with 'What must go right?'
 - The relationship is crucial but doesn't usually realise it's full potential. Why?

Anyone can hold up a mirror and tell me how ugly I am ...



Getting due diligence right.

- Is there a difference between public and private sector?
 - The investment decision
 - Accountable but to who?
- Making the right decision versus the appearance of the right one.
 - Can auditing help with both?



Governance and control of 3rd parties

- Legally you are accountable for them.
- Their governance and control is your risk.
 - Lead by example.
 - You don't know what you don't know.
 - Effective internal audit is an opportunity for continuous improvement.
 - Sticks, carrots and consequences.



Effective gateways and controls

- Accountability
 - Stakeholders demand accountability.
- Risk Management
 - A balance between risk and opportunity.
- Decision Making
 - Sound oversight and governance practice guide decision making from start to finish.
- Internal Audit and 'Line of Sight'



Developing meaningful metrics

- If you don't measure something, you can't change it.
- A project manager will balance schedule, budget and performance to achieve objectives and business requirements.
 - Which one is the priority?
- An effective internal audit function will help validate, challenge and interpret the data that feeds project management metrics
- Governance and controls won't be effective without the supporting data and metrics to inform decision making.
